Just a note to update you on the ALC dinner -- we spoke with Mayor Newsom upon our arrival, then checked out the silent auction, spoke with SF JACLers Patty Wada, Dale Minami, Lucy Kishiue, Greg Marutani, and met new member Berkeley JACLers Mushim Ikeda-Nash and her husband Chris. Then UC Berkeley Professor Ron Takaki came over to the two JACL tables, which were nicely situated side by side in the middle of the room, and exchanged greetings and handshakes. Later in his speech, which centered largely on immigration, he credited the JACL for the 1952 reversal of the law barring Asians from US citizenship. He also mentioned the JACL was present and asked that we wave so everyone could identify us. Fellow UC Berkeley professor (and Berkeley JACLe) Jere Takahashi was there, too, as was half of the surviving Korematsu family and Yuri Kochiyama. It was great fun and a very productive evening!

### **From Race Tension to Bridge Building in Our Backyard**

As part of our continued Civil Rights work in the Lorin District of South Berkeley following the dissemination of an anti-Japanese hate flyer in January, the Berkeley JACL facilitated a neighborhood meeting to initiate dialogue about the real issue of race and class tension between African Americans and Asian Americans in our community. The meeting, held on May 12, 2006 was attended by people from the Lorin District businesspeople's association; the legislative aide to Berkeley Councilmember Max Anderson; as well as representatives from the League of Women Voters of Berkeley, Albany, and Emeryville, and the Buddhist Peace Fellowship (BPF).

The group recognized the strengths of Berkeley and Oakland as its diversity, high level of activity, and social engagement. They also recognized the challenges

in our community being drug-related crime, darkness, and a feeling of unsafety walking down the street at night, particularly for women. Two actions were identified: 1)- Organizing to get more streetlights on Alcatraz Avenue and 2)- Berkeley JACL and BPF's participation in the upcoming Berkeley Juneteenth Festival, a street fair drawing approximately 40,000 community members each year.

At the street fair on Sunday, June 18, Berkeley JACL will have a booth to distribute literature and open conversations with people who live and work in the Lorin district. On June 19, 1865, two and a half years after Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation, Union soldiers landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free. One surmised reason why the slaves were not told about their freedom for more than two years after the war ended was because plantation owners wanted to retain their labor force. ### **2006 National JACL Convention in Phoenix, AZ**

Later this month, Jim Duff and Val Yasukochi will be going to the 39<sup>th</sup> JACL Biennial JACL Convention as our delegates. Gordon Kono and I will be alternates – but we're hoping we remain alternates! This convention, Berkeley JACL is sponsoring a resolution titled "Policy on Racial Epithets and Other Derogatory Remarks." We've gotten a lot of support from individual chapters as well as the entire district council and district executive board's endorsement. We're hoping that the resolution will pass easily since it's on the consent calendar and discussion is not necessary.

So, what exactly happens at these conventions? Do we just schmooze and meet people? Well, that's part of it. The biennial convention is where delegates from all chapters come together to vote on resolutions, constitution and bylaw changes, Program for Action (JACL's goals and objectives for the new biennium), national candidates, and, most important, the infamous budget.

Many national candidates have been asking us for our endorsement. The Board has given our representatives lots of direction. Issues were discussed in detail at our last board meeting. Hot topics included: the proposed budget which includes a \$5 membership dues, a 2.5% COLA to all national staff members, and the move to annual conventions. ### **Berkeley JACL Donates to the Friends and Family of Nisei Veterans (FFNV)**

At its May board meeting, the Berkeley JACL Board of Directors unanimously decided to donate money to the Friends and Family of Nisei Veterans' annual memorial service.

On Saturday, May 20, 2006, the Friends and Family of Nisei Veterans held their annual memorial service. Located in the quiet of Robert's Park in

Oakland, CA, we listened to the music of the Peninsula Scout Band, remembering those still with us and those who are not. The serenity of the park must be in complete contrast to what the men of the 442nd, 100th, and MIS endured in WWII. Perhaps it's symbolic that they have found and made their peace. More tangible is the 442nd plaque and 14-year-old redwood tree located in the Buena Vista site, the only memorial in the entire East Bay Regional Park District.

The redwood tree will grow just like the gratitude we all feel for the veterans. This year, with more youth in attendance, it was a sign that the soldiers' sacrifice and honor will never be forgotten.

After the service, I sat with San Jose's Fred and Dorothy Kitajima and Walter Tanaka. I first met them at last year's service. Though Fred and Walter were part of the Military Intelligence Service (MIS), they've attended two years in a row to see the other veterans. Fred reminisced about his military training, carrying twice his weight in supplies as he ran on sand at Fort Ord. He said, "By the time I got on my 5th mile, all I wanted to do was get rid of the gun because it was weighing me down." As MIS, he was required to carry two dictionaries, each the size of a 10-pound bag of flour, on all his military missions.

As always, the service is held on Armed Forces Day, the third Saturday of May. I hope to see you there next year.

### **More about the Friends and Family of Nisei Veterans**

The next meeting of the FFNV will be Saturday, August 5, on the USS Hornet in Alameda. The meeting will start at 11AM, and the Peninsula Scout Band will perform again. RSVPs are needed as "sushi box" lunches will be ordered at a cost of \$10 per person. FFNV has arranged to have \$14 admission fee waived for this event. Even though the 442<sup>nd</sup>/MIS exhibit has been open since last April, this is considered the official opening of the exhibit showing the contribution of the American of Japanese ancestry. We extend an invitation to everyone to join the FFNV again on Saturday, August 5, to help celebrate the end of the war against Japan. There will be many exhibits showing how the 6,000 Nisei that served in the Military Intelligence Service proved to be America's "Secret Weapon" in the war in the Pacific.

### **Berkeley JACL Awards Scholarships**

The Berkeley Chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League held its annual scholarship awards luncheon on May 6, at the Berkeley Doubletree Hotel and Conference Center on the Berkeley Marina. Six graduating seniors received scholarships in recognition of their scholastic achievements, personal statements, community involvement, and group interview. Honored at the awards luncheon were: Jeffrey Griffin of Berkeley High, Mathew Hamasaki of Berkeley High, Yuki Jitoshu of St. Joseph High, Mark Muranishi of Head Royce, Zachary Scott of Skyline High, and Alexandra Tagawa of Angelo Rodriguez High. Griffin received the third annual Bea Kono Memorial Scholarship – established by the Kono family in memory of Bea, a long time JACL supporter, past chapter president, and a former recipient of the chapter's "Pioneer Award".

Past scholarship recipients, Christine Hironaka, a freshman at Stanford University t, and Megan Scott, a graduate of New York University, delivered personal accounts of their early years in college, and offered advice and shared experiences learned during their college years.

The chapter also honored Pioneer Award recipient Jim Furuichi, and recognized him for his individual contribution to the Berkeley JACL and the communities it serves. Furuichi is the owner of Kuwada Realty in Berkeley and was instrumental in numerous fund raising activities for the Berkeley JACL

The keynote speaker was Kenji Taguma, Vice President and English Editor of the Nichi Bei Times newspaper. Taguma provided a chronology of the origin and history of the paper and discussed the major format change recently implemented. He stated that while the visionary founders of the Nichi Bei Times started the newspaper to get the community "reconnected" after the wartime incarceration in American internment camps, today, in the face of assimilation and community dispersal, Taguma sees "the paper's role as keeping the community connected, informed, and empowered".

Major sponsors of the scholarship program were also honored including Gary, George, and Gordon

Kono, Mr. Sam Fox (Union Bank, Walnut Creek), Mr. Craig Oki (Bank of America, Concord), Mr. Dan Date of Oakland (past Pioneer Award recipient), and Mr. Denny Suzuki (Horizon Beverage, Oakland).

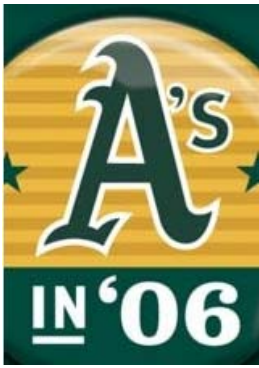
